## ELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR 2013-14

The Post Adjutant shall give notice of the annual election at least (2) weeks prior to said elections being held at the regular Post meeting for the month of May. Pursuant to the above, Election of Officers shall be for Commander, 1st Vice-Commander, 2nd Vice-Commander, Finance Officer, Historian, Chaplain, Sgt. at Arms, Judge Advocate, Service Officer, and Executive Board, which shall consist of six members. Soldiers Field Veterans Memorial Inc. and Southeast Minnesota Honor Flight are proud to announce the exclusive showing of "Honor Flight, One Last Mission". This movie is a heartwarming documentary about four living World War Two veterans and a Midwest community coming together to give them the trip of a lifetime to Washington D.C. to see the memorial constructed for them in 2005, nearly 60 years after the War. The movie accurately reflects the experiences of the 1,032 veterans and hundreds of
