

## Presidential Program

President arrives in Rochester on special Chicago and North Western train from Twin Cities, which will stop at the Second Avenue N W crossing.

President is greeted in his train by official committee, including the Mayo brothers and wives, Governor Olson and state, national and Rochester representatives of the American Legion, including the members of general citation committee. Other members of general citation committee greet him outside train, and president leaves for Mayo park to lay wreath at the statue of Dr. William Worrall Mayo.

The president leaves Clinic for Soldier Field to honor presentation of American Legion citation to the brothers.

Address, Michael F. Murray of St. Cloud, state Legion commander.

Address and presentation of national citations, Edward A. Hayes national Legion commander.

Response, Dr. Charles H. Mayo.

Unveiling of McCoy post plaque in honor of Mayo brothers by Mayo Walters, six year old grandson of Dr. and Mrs. William J. Mayo, and Mildred Mayo, six year old granddaughter of Dr. and Mrs. Charles H. Mayo.

Noon - President leaves for Mayowood to be a luncheon guest of the Mayo brothers and their wives, accompanied by Mrs. Roosevelt, his sons, Franklin, Jr. and John, cabinet members. Other distinguished guests will attend buffet luncheon in Kahler hotel as guests of city, officials.

President and distinguished guests parade through business district and leave Rochester on North Broadway proceeding to Lake City, where a dock will be dedicated, and to Wabasha.

The Osman Temple Shrine band of St. Paul, The Rochester American Legion drum corps, the Post 8 drum corps of St. Paul, and the La Crosse Legion drum corps, national champions for four years, will be among units appearing.
