We welcome the newest member to Tammy Grendahl's family, Anne Ray Servis who was born on Oct. 5th. Congratulations Tammy & Family!

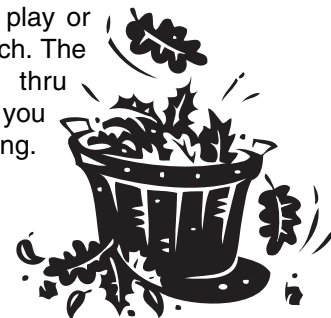
Keep all service men and women in your thoughts and prayers and I hope to see you at the November 16th meeting.


