I am bringing in different entertainment monthly, so stop by and check us out on a Friday or some Saturday nights as well... See the monthly Calendar for details.

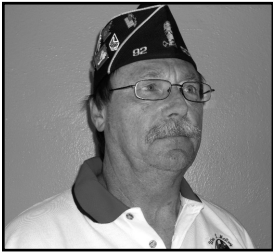



## **KOREAN WAR VETERANS CLUB**

As Adjutant of the Korean War Veterans Club in Rochester these past 9 years, I have written 108 articles for the monthly Bugle publication of the American Legion. In all, I have written about people and events taking place each month while keeping out personal opinions. As of October 26th 2014, at our annual meeting, I will step down as Adjutant so being this is the last article I write; this article will include my opinions.

Presently, we have the National Korean War Association meeting taking place in Rochester from October 15th - 19th, 2014. Having already visited with the National Chairmen of Membership Recruitment and the National Treasurer, I am reminded of how Veterans and others are impressed with our city. While our local 215 member KWVC is comprised of Veterans who served anywhere from 1950 to 1955, the National Organization allows Veterans who served in Korea after 1955 to be members. Conclusion, unless we allow membership to belong as the National Organization does, we will be a dead-man's club - the

average age of local KWVC members is 80 to 85 while National is approx. 70 years.

Changing topics, while the following does not pertain to our local KWVC directly, an organization has attempted to build a museum honoring Veterans, Police, Fire, and First Responders in Rochester but the City Parks dept. and many city officials have indicated no such museum should ever be built in the vicinity of Soldiers Field. As a Veteran I question this attitude and really wonder if our beautiful Veterans Memorial would ever be built with today's mindset of local officials who keep talking about keeping "green" space. People coming into Rochester for conventions are being told to go to Lake City, Wabasha, Austin, Twin Cities, and other locations as the Veterans Memorial is about the only location to view and tour in Rochester.

Along those lines, with the present conditions of land use being contemplated in downtown Rochester, I wonder if the VFW and American Legion facilities are in jeopardy at this time.

In closing, I'm sure all of our retiring officers feel it has been an honor to serve our KWVC Veterans and all Veterans these past several years. We thank each of you for allowing us the opportunity to do so.

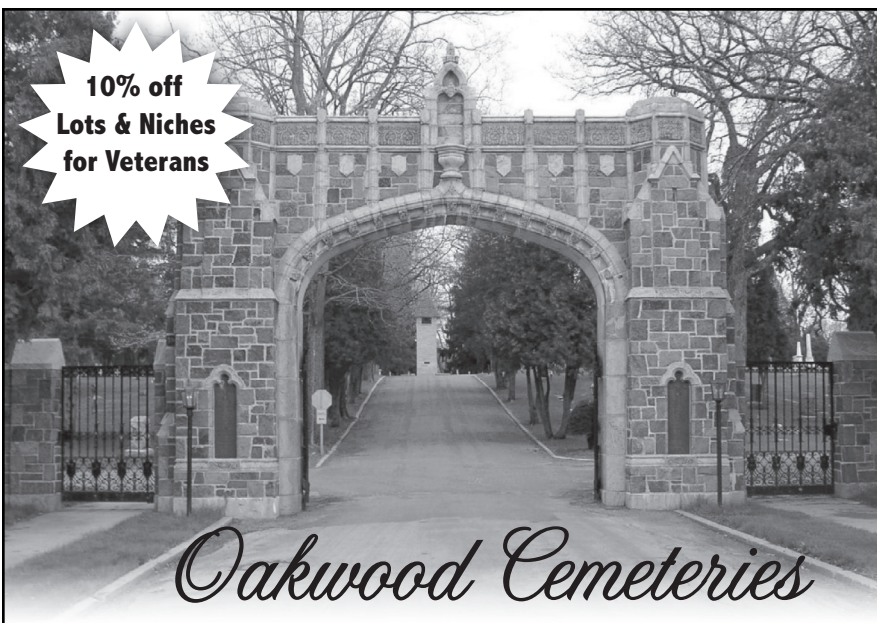
