### Legion legislative report

As for legislation there will be advocating, lobbying and pushing for legislative bills at the Congressional level, the current initiative is to push for the Vietnam War Period Date change, which will be presented to all Post's this coming year for approval. For MN, this will begin the third year pushing for two gambling tax reduction bills (called the 9% & 6% bills), in getting both bills into the House & Senate committees, and push thru to the Governor's signature. This will be a long journey, based on the property tax reduction bill (33% reduction) which was lobbied for and was passed and signed by the Governor last year.
